**What**: A synagogue-based inclusive program for Jewish teenagers with developmental challenges that focuses on life skills, social skills, and Jewish education.

**Who:** Jewish teens aged 13-21 who have social, developmental, and/or intellectual disabilities.

**Where**: Congregation Kol Ami 252 Soundview Avenue White Plains, NY 10606

When: Wednesday evenings from 6:00-8:00, the same evening as Kol Ami's Religious School program for typically developing middle school and high school students.

Yad B'Yad was created to fill the void that currently exists for Jewish teens in Westchester County with developmental challenges. When children reach adolescence the gap widens significantly between those with developmental challenges and their typically-developing peers. This program strives to narrow that gap by providing teens with a curriculum that increases their "social savvy" and their knowledge of critical life skills.

The program also strives to strengthen the Jewish identity of the students through the study of Jewish holidays, traditions, culture, and values.

Head teachers in each class have masters degrees in special education or related fields and considerable teaching experience. Our head teachers work alongside co-teachers or teaching assistants and specialists to create an engaging, lively, and meaningful experience for our students.

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
